

CODE OF CONDUCT

Success at RISE depends on the partnership between student, parent, teachers and Directors. We require our RISE parents and students to carefully review this Code of Conduct. The expectations and consequences stated below are required at RISE. Upon completion of reading this document, we ask that both parent and student digitally sign this form. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.

Code of Conduct

RISE is intended to provide instruction to self-disciplined young men and women. Students must be prepared, attentive, and free from distraction to benefit from this type of educational opportunity. All students are expected to conduct themselves in accordance with biblical standards and in a manner which will not be distracting to other students. (See Below)

"Only let your conduct be worthy of the gospel of Christ." Philippians 1:27

STUDENTS:

- Students who participate in RISE will act in such a way that their words and actions promote the unity and encouragement of fellow RISE students.
- Students will avoid acting in such a way that is considered disrespectful, offensive, immoral, intimidating or bullying.
- Students and parents must dress modestly adhering to the Dress Policy set forth in the RISE Handbook. Students who arrive at RISE dressed inappropriately (in judgment of any RISE instructor or Director) will be sent home or will be provided with appropriate clothing.
- Students will Not gossip to or about other students or families.
- Students must respect the property of others by not touching anything that does not belong to them unless they have permission.
- Students must respect the church property.
- Students are expected to complete all assignments thoroughly and on time.
- Students must be in their seats and prepared before the start of the class period. They may not wait for their teacher to call them to class.
- Poor or disrespectful attitudes towards instructors are grounds for dismissal without refunds.
- The student must respect the individual teacher's classroom cellphone policy. Refer to the RISE Handbook for the general cellphone use policy.

CENTER POINT FACILITY:

- Center Point Church has ministry functions throughout the week and an active church office, therefore we must be respectful while on the church campus.
- Students may not run in the building or hallways. The halls must be kept clear and quiet.
- Eating and drinking is only allowed in the gym area, except bottled water. All trash must be picked up and thrown away immediately before leaving the gym area. Students may not use the church's kitchen, refrigerator, ice machine, microwave or supplies.
- Students may not sit or climb on the tables or counters.
- Bathrooms should not be used to congregate; they should be left clean and in order.
- Any damage caused by a student to the building, tables, etc. is the financial responsibility of that student and his/her family. (Defacing walls, tables, buildings, etc.)
- Students may not go into any part of the building other than the assigned classrooms and specially designated areas.

Disciplinary Action

<u>First Infraction</u> - verbal warning by Teacher, Director, or Dean of Students and an Infraction form will be sent home and placed in student's file.

<u>Second Infraction</u> -removal from class and an immediate phone call to the parent. Student will sit with Dean of Students until parent can come pick up their student. An Infraction form will be sent home and placed in student's file. A parent conference with the Teacher and/or Directors is required before student is allowed to return to class.

<u>Third Infraction</u> - Removal from the RISE program for the remainder of the school year.

Students who do not abide by the RISE Code of Conduct and have three Infractions based on the Disciplinary Actions listed above will result in the students being dismissed from the RISE program without refund.
